### **Current research**

*Sustaining Activism in Dark Times: Fear and Hope in Russia*. Book manuscript and articles.

When massive demonstrations form quickly, it can seem as though millions of individuals independently decided to leave their living rooms and take to the streets at the same time and with the same purpose. But scholars of social movements know that image oversimplifies reality. In fact, networks of activists usually have been at work long before visible signs of protest, and they have struggled to convince others to join them. This often-unheralded work is the critical foundation of the more public acts that later capture attention. This book explores how activists convince themselves and others to keep at this difficult project even when it seems unlikely that they will shortly win.

Field research for this project was conducted in Tbilisi, Kiev, Moscow, and St. Petersburg during March and April 2007 and in Russia in March 2008, June 2011, and March 2018. This research was supported by the International Research and Exchanges Board, and the Beaumont, Mellon, and Stolle funds at Saint Louis University.

In 2012 and 2013, faculty from across Saint Louis University came together to protest an increasingly autocratic and out-of-touch administration. In this interdisciplinary edited volume, participants in the no-confidence movement analyze those events from a variety of disciplinary perspectives. In addition to editing the whole volume, I contributed three chapters:

*Out of Order: Russian Political Values in an Imperfect World*. Pennsylvania State University Press, 2007.

This book uses original intensive interviews with ordinary Russians to show how the sometimes disorderly and unpredictable reality produced by recent political and economic transformations has shaped the political values of Russian citizens. The interviews show how Russians' experiences have left them with a preference for order, but they also show how this preference for order can be consistent with other democratic values.

The field research for this book consisted of more than sixty interviews conducted between 1998 and 2003 in Moscow, Krasnoyarsk, Novosibirsk, Smolensk, Ulyanovsk, Voronezh and in a number of small towns in Moscow oblast and Siberia. This research was supported by Fulbright-Hays, the International Research and Exchanges Board, the American Political Science Association, and the Beaumont and Mellon funds at Saint Louis University.
