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Saint Louis University and YouGov surveyed 900 likely Missouri voters from August 8 to August 16 about the Missouri U.S. Senate race, current political issues, abortion policy, and education policy in Missouri. The following pages present results for most survey questions. The margin of error for survey results for the full sample is 3.75%. Funding and Support

The Saint Louis University PRiME Center provided the majority of funding for the SLU/YouGov Poll. The origins of the SLU/YouGov Poll lie in an internal Big Ideas competition to define university-wide strategic research priorities sponsored by the Saint Louis University Research Institute. The Big Ideas competition provides funding to research initiatives that demonstrate broad faculty engagement, strong leadership and compelling research plans.

Methodology and Weighting

YouGov interviewed 1228 respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 900 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The frame was constructed by stratified sampling from the full 2019 American Community Survey (ACS) 1-year sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the person weights on the public use file).

The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post stratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on 2016 and 2020 Presidential vote choice, and a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), to produce the final weight.
